

Independent auditor's report to members of Professional Cross Country Club of Tasmania Inc

I have audited the special purpose financial report of the Professional Cross Country Club of Tasmania Inc (the Club) for year ended 31 October 2015.

Management Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report

These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with Australian Accounting Concepts and Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) (where applicable), and statutory requirements so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Club's financial position and the results of its operations and cash flows.

The audit opinion in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Independence

To the best of my knowledge and belief, there has been no contravention of auditor independence and any applicable code of professional conduct in relation to the audit.


Limitation of Scope
